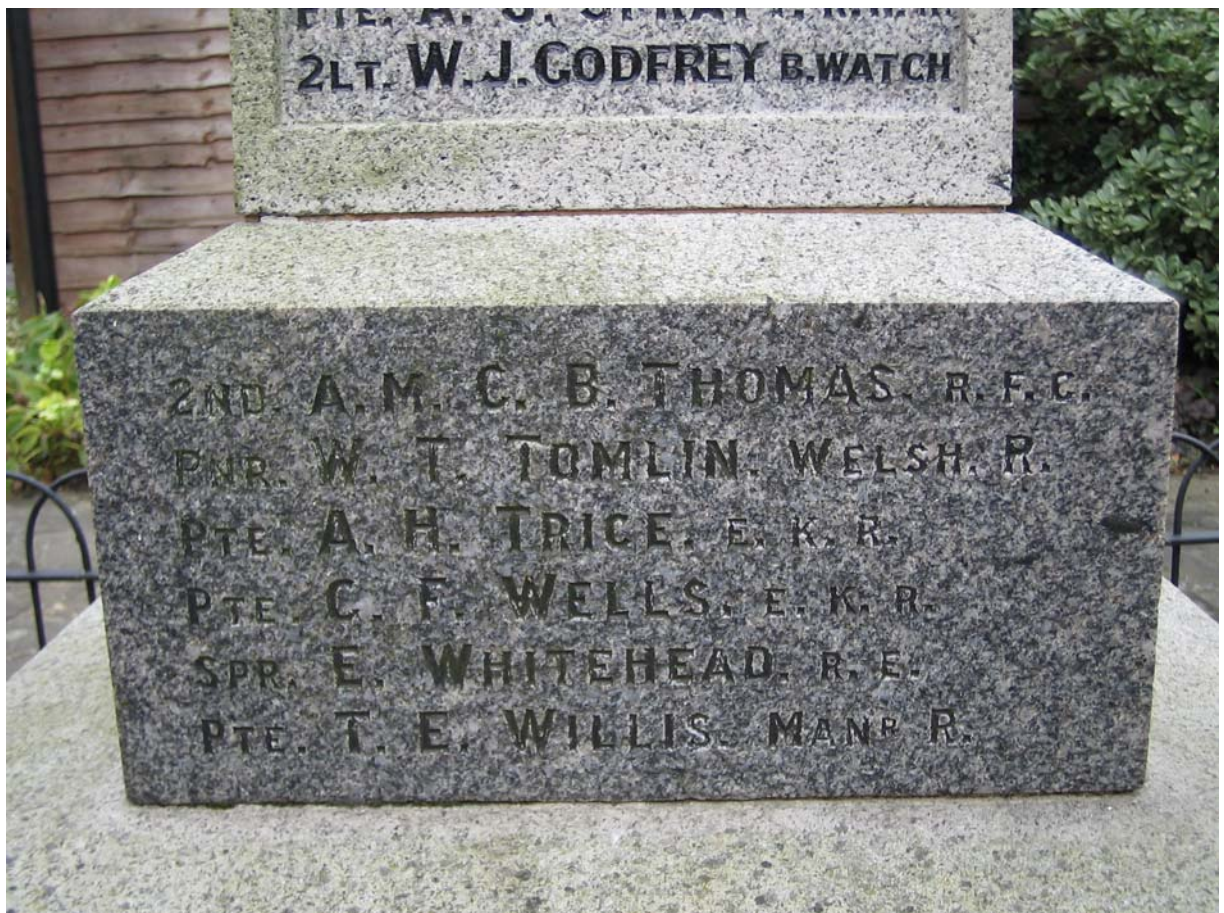
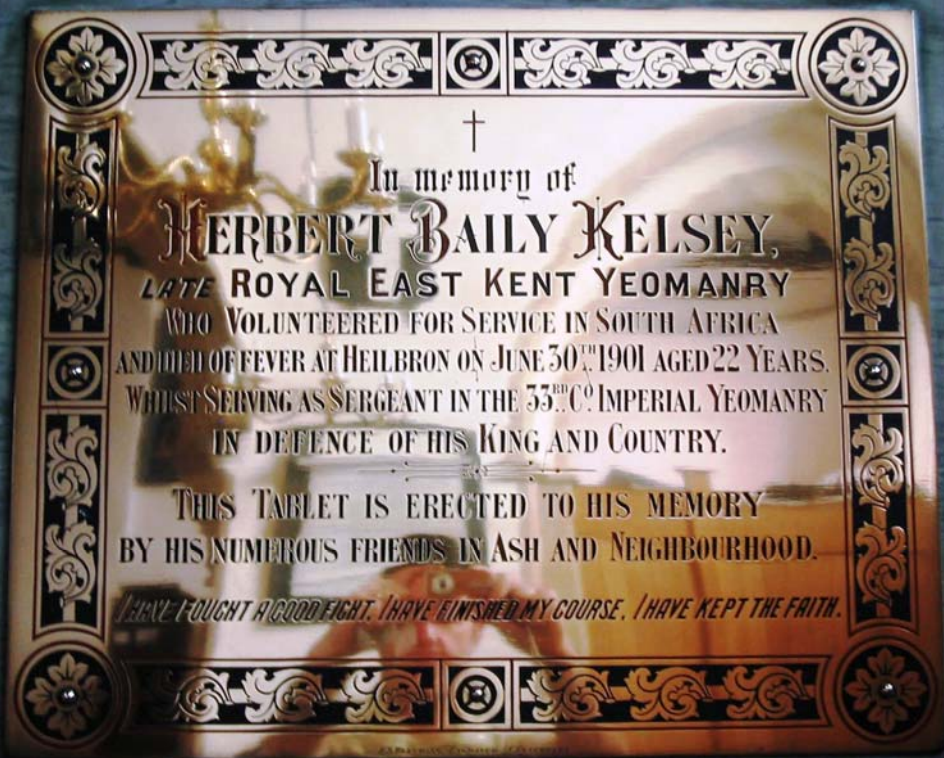

LATE ROYAL EAST KENT YEOMANRY  
WHO VOLUNTEERED FOR SERVICE IN SOUTH AFRICA  
AND DIED OF FEVER AT HEILBRON ON JUNE 30<sup>TH</sup> 1901 AGED 22 YEARS.  
WHILE SERVING AS SERGEANT IN THE 53<sup>RD</sup> CO IMPERIAL YEOMANRY  
IN DEFENCE OF HIS KING AND COUNTRY.

BY HIS NUMEROUS FRIENDS IN ASH AND NEIGHBOURHOOD.

SACRED TO THE MEMORY OF  
**ARTHUR WILLIAM GODFREY,**  
SECOND SON OF JOHN AND AUGUSTA ISABELLA GODFREY,  
OF BROOKE HOUSE, IN THIS PARISH  
BORN AT ST HELIERS JERSEY JANY 19<sup>TH</sup> 1829.  
ENTERED 2<sup>ND</sup> BATT. RIFLE BRIGADE AS 2<sup>ND</sup> LIEUT. DECY 30<sup>TH</sup> 1845,  
FROM R.M. COLLEGE SANDHURST.  
SERVED IN NOVA SCOTIA AND LOWER CANADA  
AND AS LIEUT. 1<sup>ST</sup> BATT. IN THE KAFFIR WAR OF 1852-53  
FOR WHICH HE OBTAINED THE MEDAL  
SERVED ALSO WITH DISTINCTION IN THE CRIMEA  
AND GAINED THE MEDAL AND 3 CLASPS FOR  
ALMA BALAKLAVA INKERMANN  
DIED ON THE 27<sup>TH</sup> NOVY 1854, OF CHOLERA, IN CAMP BEFORE SEBASTOPOL.  
HIS BROTHER OFFICERS IN AFFECTIONATE COMMEMORATION  
OF HIS WORTH AND GALLANTRY  
ERECTED A STONE OVER HIS GRAVE ON  
CATHCARTS HILL.  
*"THE RIGHTEOUS HATH HOPE IN HIS DEATH."*  
THIS MONUMENT IS ERRECTED BY THOSE TO WHOM ALONE HIS VALUE  
AND ENDEARING QUALITIES WERE FULLY KNOWN.
