

ASHFORD BAPTIST CHURCH has existed at least since 1653.

A new meeting house (comprising the present lounge and the hall above it) was erected in 1829. When the present chapel was built in 1881, the original building because a schoolroom and extra rooms were added to 93. Following the First World War the upper the were dedicated as a Memorial Institute to be who had fallen, and for the upper the service of those who had fallen, and for the upper the service of the community

On this plate are recorded names of men who died, and the regiments in which they served.

Memorial stones to them were previously erected in the Entrance Hall below

During the Second World War these rooms were used to cater for troops stationed in Ashford until bomb damage occurred in 1943. Rebuilt in 1952, they have been used ever since for many forms of activity in the Kingdom of God

In 1995 the building was extensively redesigned and renovated for the Glory of God and for continued use in effective service and witness to Christ in the community of Ashford.
