Joseph is being added to our steadily growing number of 'Kent Fallen,' who are being submitted to the CWGC for their proper and rightful commemoration.

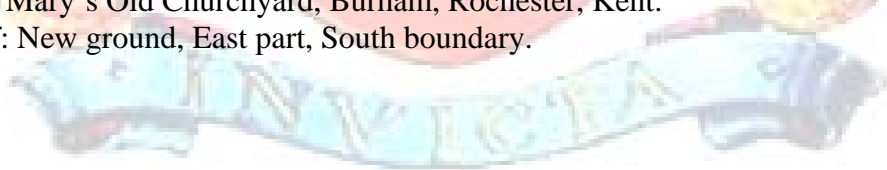
**TREADGOLD, C. W. G.** Sapper, WR/323725.

THOSE OF THE LATER CONFLICT ARE NOT SET OUT IN THE SAME FORM. TO AID RESEARCHERS, WE HAVE TAKEN THE LIBERTY OF SETTING OUT THE FOLLOWING BRIEF PARISH SECOND WORLD WAR COMMEMORATIONS IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER.

**CHEESEMAN, DOUGLAS HENRY.** Driver, T/181502.

Royal Army Service Corps. Attached to the H.Q. 1st Airborne Division.

Died 22 September 1944. Aged 23.

Born and resided Kent.

Son of Ernest and Florence Cheeseman.

Husband of H. M. Joan Cheeseman of Berry Hill, Gloucestershire.

Buried Arnhem Oosterbeek War Cemetery, Gelderland, Netherlands.

Grave Ref: 17. B. 12.

Douglas fell at the corner of Bothaweg and Oranjeweg, during 'Operation Market Garden.'

**TUPPER, THOMAS JOHN.** Aircraftman 2nd Class, 1460716.

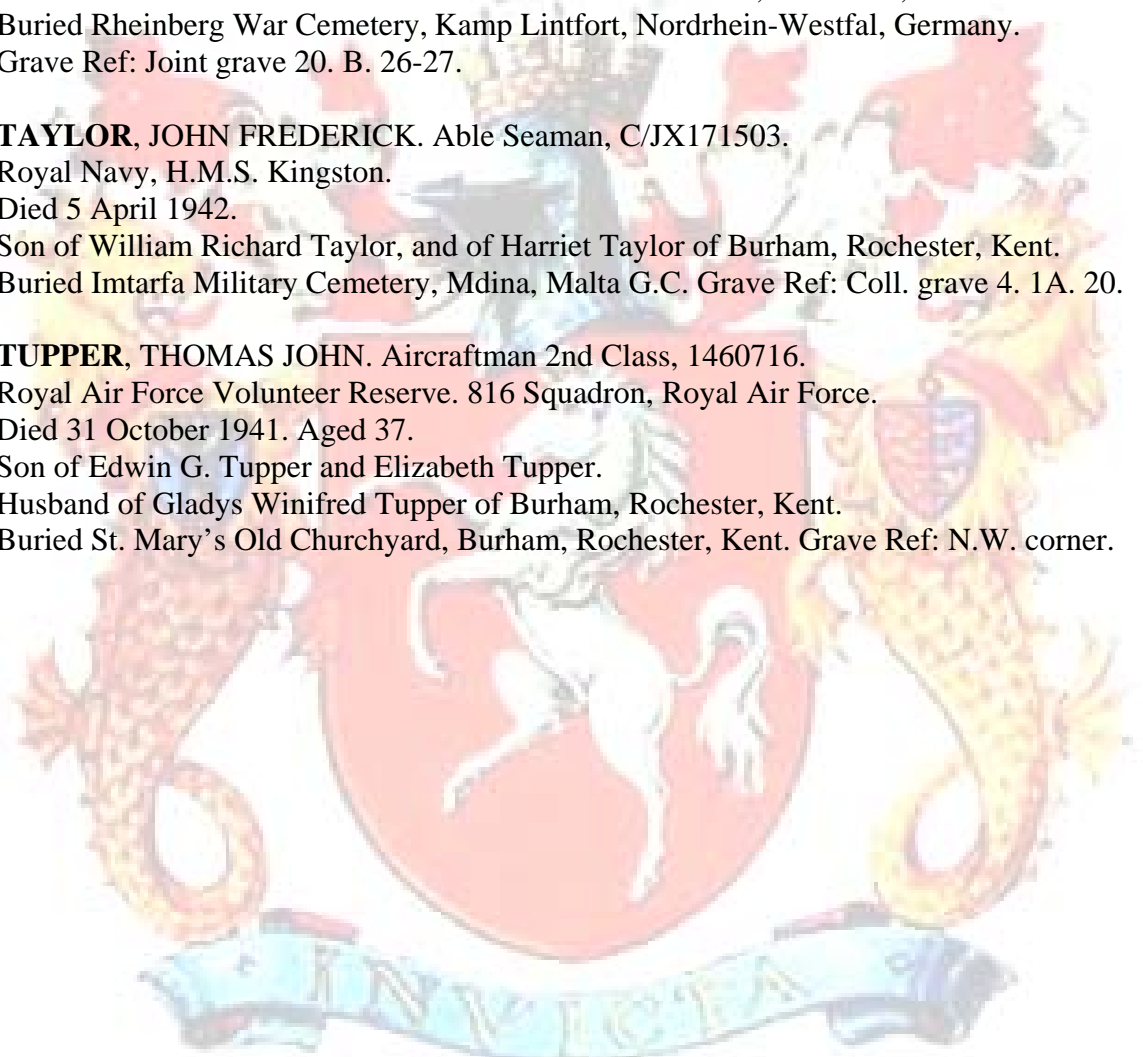
