

# DOVER PATROL

## War Memorial

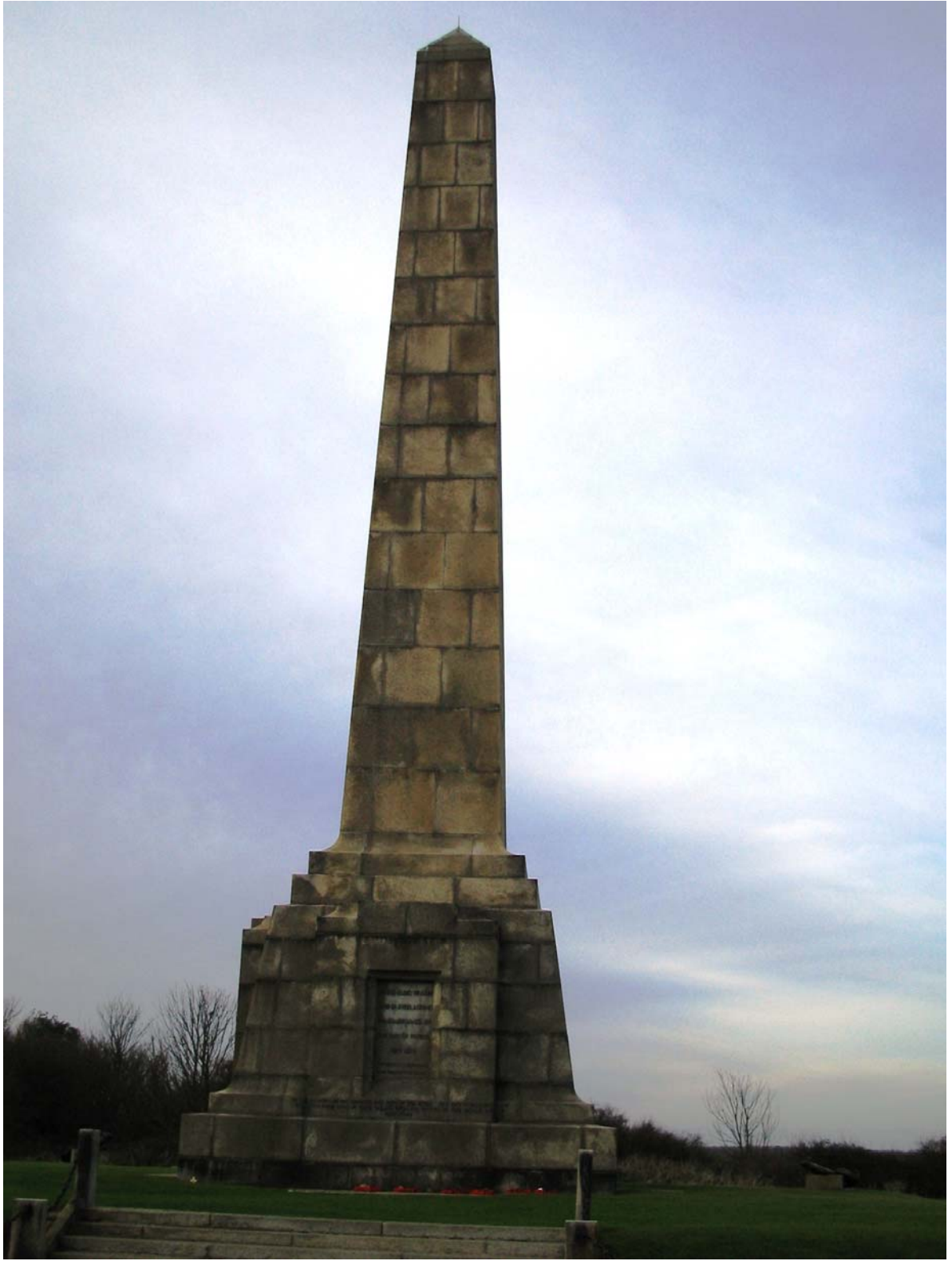


This large and impressive war memorial is located overlooking the English Channel at St Margarets-at-Cliffe near Dover. It commemorates the men who both served and died in the Dover Patrol during the Great War. The Dover Patrol was a Royal Navy Home Command Naval Force tasked with guarding the English Channel approaches and denying the enemy its use during the Great War.

In addition to the memorial itself there is a book of remembrance in the St Margarets parish church that contains the names of men belonging to the Dover Patrol who served and made the ultimate sacrifice in doing so.

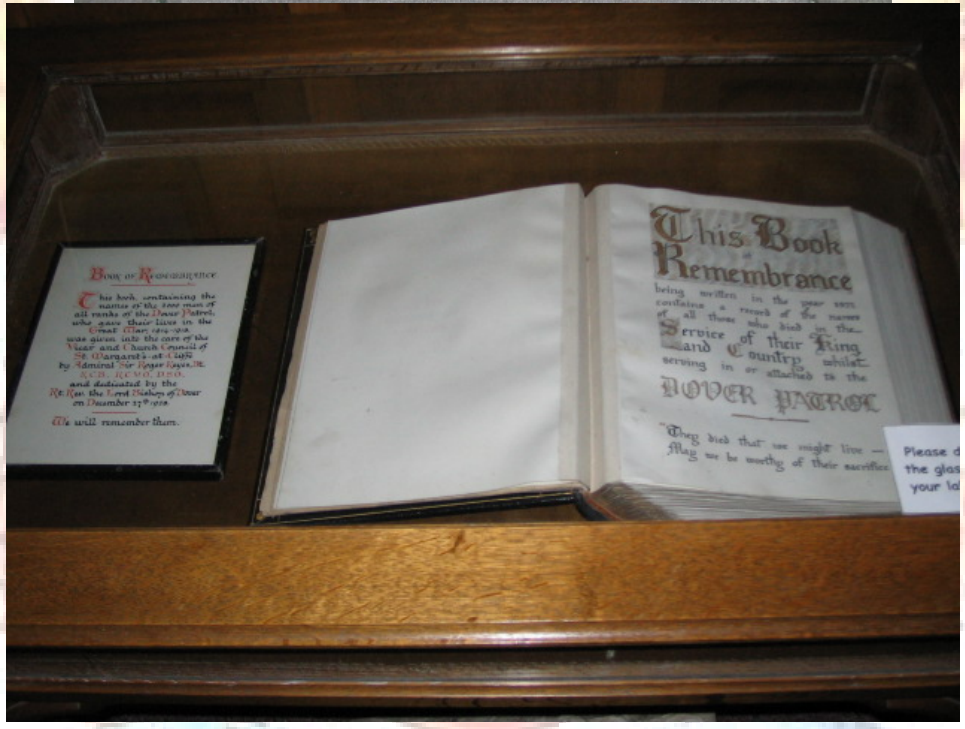

**BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE**

Richard Keyes, on December 17<sup>th</sup> 1918.
