BALKWILL C.V

Second Lieutenant Charles Vince BALKWILL. 1/5th Battalion (London Rifle Brigade), London Regiment. Died 1st July 1916 (first day of the Battle of The Somme).

BALKWILL J

Second Lieutenant John BALKWILL. 6th Battalion, Royal Warwickshire Regiment.

Died 1 July 1916 aged 33 years (first day of the Battle of The Somme).

STERNDAL- BENNETT W

Commander Walter SERNDAL- BENNETT, D.S.O. & Bar. Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (RNVR)..Drake Battalion, Royal Naval Division (RND). Died 7th November 1917 aged 24 years.

BEALE C.L

Corporal L/9902 Charles Louis BEALE. 1st Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 20th July 1915 aged 20 years.

BEALE S

Private L/6554 Simeon BEALE. 1st Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 25th December 1914.

HOPER A.E

Private 5454 Alfred Edgar HOPER. 2nd Battalion, Leinster Regiment (Prince of Wales) (Royal Canadians). Died 12th April 1917.

HOPER A

Private S/9594 Arthur HOPER. 2nd Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 3rd May 1915 aged 22 years.


KEMP H.J

Private G/4615 Herbert James KEMP. "C" Company, 2nd Battalion, The Queens (Royal West Surrey Regiment). Died 25th September 1915 aged 25 years.

UNDERHILL T.W

Second Lieutenant Thomas William UNDERHILL. The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 19th August 1916 aged 19 years.

Second Lieutenant 141310 James STERNDALÉ-BENNETT M.C. 6th (H.D) Battalion, The Buffs (Royal East Kent Regiment). Died 14th March 1941 aged 51 years.

Gunner 835697 Percy Hoper WHITEHEAD. 71st Field Regiment, Royal Artillery (R.A). Died 17th June 1940 aged 26 years.

CHURCH C.J

Sergeant (Air Gunner) 1355162 Charles Joseph CHURCH. Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve (RAFVR). Died 11th June 1943 aged 23 years.
