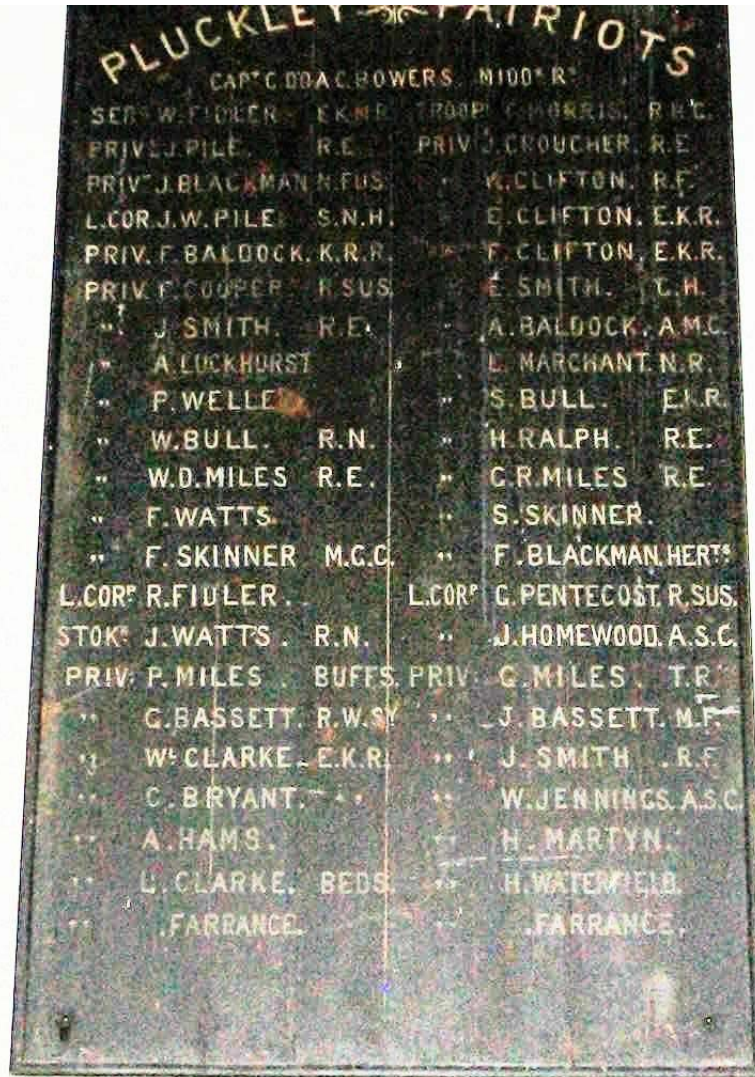

**Private T WILLCOCK. Machine Gun Section, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment).** The Kentish Express reported him wounded in the hand during April 1916. He was recovering in Bombay Military Hospital, India. Son of W Willcock of Dering Terrace, Pluckley, Ashford, Kent. Before the outbreak of war T Willcock was employed at the Pluckley Brick and Tile Company (Pluckley brick works).

This man's name appears on the Pluckley School Roll of Honour.
