Attached 1<sup>st</sup> battalion, King`s Own Yorkshire Light Infantry.** Died 11<sup>th</sup> March 1918. Son of Reverent E.A. Alderson (Chaplain to the Forces, 1<sup>st</sup> Class) and Mary Alderson of "Weeford," River, Dover, Kent. Buried Struma Military Cemetery, Greece. Grave reference VI.F.II.

## AMOS A.E

**Gunner 52863 Albert Edward AMOS. 25<sup>th</sup> Siege Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery (RGA).** Died 14<sup>th</sup> October 1916 aged 22 years. Born Peckham, London. Enlisted Dover. Resided River, Dover. Buried Grove Town Cemetery, Somme, France. Grave reference I.L.45.

## BALDING F

**Corporal 10207 Frank BALDING. Royal Army Pay Corps (RAPC). Formerly (14220) 24<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Manchester Regiment.** Died 13<sup>th</sup> July 1918 aged 25 years. Born Ranley, Louth. Enlisted Oldham. Husband of Evelyn Beatrice Balding of 8 The Avenue, Kearsney, Dover. Buried Louth Cemetery, Lincolnshire. Grave reference 27.71.

The memorial shows Frank as serving in the Manchester Regiment. Frank is also commemorated on the Louth, Lincolnshire war memorial.

Arthur was probably mortally wounded at Gallipoli and was recovered to Egypt where he eventually died.

## TULL W.D

**Second Lieutenant Walter David (aka Daniel John TULL). 5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Middlesex Regiment. Attached 23<sup>rd</sup> Battalion (formerly 17<sup>th</sup> Battalion) Middlesex Regiment.** Died 25<sup>th</sup> March 1918 aged 29 years. Born Folkestone 28<sup>th</sup> April 1888. Son of Daniel Tull. Brother of Edward Tull-Warnock of 419 St Vincent Street, Glasgow. Commemorated on the Arras Memorial, Pas de Calais, France. Bay 7.

Walter Tull was the grandson of a slave. Prior to the outbreak of the war he was a professional footballer with both Tottenham Hotspurs and Northampton Town. He played more than a hundred games for Northampton Town prior to WW1. Despite the regulations which prevailed at the time regarding officers, Walter became the **British army's first Black officer**. He was Mentioned in Dispatches for his actions at the Battle of Piave, Italy. Walter was later shot and killed when leading his men at Favreuil, Somme counter-attacking the Great German offensive that commenced on 21<sup>st</sup> March 1918. His standing amongst the men could be judged by the extraordinary number that risked their lives in a vain attempt to save him.

Walter is also commemorated on the WALTER TULL Memorial and Garden of Rest at Northampton which was unveiled on the 7<sup>th</sup> November 1999.

It is not known what his Dover connections were and how he came to be placed on the River civic war memorial.

Son of Frank William George and Hilda Frances Axford of River, Dover, Kent. Buried Kiel War Cemetery, Schleswig-Holstein, Germany. Grave reference 4.D.1.

Pilot Officer R N Rayne was taken prisoner when the Hamden (AE202) he was flying (PT-X) crashed near Tanning. The rest of the crew were buried nearby and were then subsequently reinterred after WW2 to Kiel War Cemetery.
