ALDERSON A.E

Captain Evelyn ALDERSON. 3rd Battalion, The Queen`s (Royal West Surrey Regiment). Attached 1st Battalion, King`s Own Yorkshire Light Infantry. Died 11th March 1918. Son of E.A. Alderson (Chaplain to the Forces, 1st Class) and Mary Alderson of "Weeford", River, Dover, Kent. Buried Struma Military Cemetery, Greece. Grave reference VI.F.11.

BALDWIN T

Petty Officer Stoker K/12579 Thomas BALDWIN. Royal Navy. H.M.S. Partridge. Died 12th December 1917 aged 28 years. Son of Thomas and Frances Baldwin of Chapel Street, Temple Ewell, Dover, Kent. Commemorated on the Chatham Naval Memorial. Panel reference - 23.

H.M.S. Partridge was sunk off the coast of Norway while on escort duties by four German destroyers.

Gunner 164218 Geoffrey Phillip BUNTING. 217th Siege Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery (RGA). Died 9th April 1918 aged 27 years. Born Anmer, Norfolk. Enlisted Dover. Son of John Bunting of Kings Lynn, Norfolk. Husband of Jessie Mary Bunting. Commemorated on the Ploegsteert Memorial, Comines-Warneton, Hainaut, Belgium. Panel reference - 1.

CHEESEMAN H.J

Private G/6165 Herbert John CHEESEMAN. 1st Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 14th July 1916 aged 19 years. Born Ringwold, Kent. Enlisted Dover. Resided Temple Ewell. Son of Walter James and Annie Cheeseman of 1 Brook Cottages, Temple Ewell, Dover, Kent. Commemorated on the Menin Gate, Ieper, Belgium.

Private G/87575 William Staveley FORTH. 18th Battalion, Middlesex Regiment. Died 6th July 1918 aged 38 years. Born Dover. Enlisted Canterbury. Resided Dover. Son of George Frederick Samuel Forth and Elizabeth Forth of 5 Church Street, Temple Ewell, Dover, Kent. Buried Hagle Dump Cemetery, Ieper, Belgium. Grave reference I.H.4.

HARRIS G

Private 22907 George HARRIS. 8th Battalion, East Surrey Regiment. Died 3rd May 1917 aged 34 years. Born Battle, Sussex. Enlisted Canterbury. Resided Dover. Son of Thomas and Ellen Harris of Temple Ewell, Dover, Kent. Husband of Jane Grey (formerly Harris) of 30 Maison Dieu Road, Dover. Commemorated on the Arras Memorial, Pas de Calais, France. Panel reference - Bay 6.

HONEYBALL W.C

Second Lieutenant Wilfred Charles HONEYBALL. 14th Company, Machine Gun Corps (Infantry). Died 21st March 1918 aged 31 years. Son of Frederick and Kate Honeyball of "Dalday," Temple Ewell, Dover. Husband of Mabel

Honeyball of 14 Wessex Gardens, Golders Green, London. Commemorated on the Pozieres Memorial, Somme, France.

JARVIS A

Sapper 18776 Alfred Henry JARVIS. 7th Signal Company, Royal Engineers (RE). Died 30th October 1914 aged 24 years. Born Kearsney, Dover. Enlisted Dover. Son of Elizabeth Jarvis of "The Haven," Whitfield, Dover, Kent. Commemorated on the Menin Gate. Panel reference 9.

KING L.T

Sergeant 13070 Lewis Thomas KING. "D" Company, 10th Battalion, Duke of Wellington's (West Riding Regiment). Died 31st August 1916 aged 32 years. Born Loftus, Yorkshire. Enlisted Dover. Resided Loftus, Yorkshire. Husband of Ada Mary Waite (formerly King) of 4 Whitby Road, East Loftus, Yorkshire. Buried Berks Cemetery Extension, Comines-Warneton, Hainault, Belgium. Grave reference I.D.3.

MAXTED A.E

Corporal G/402 Albert Edward MAXTED. 6th Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 13th October 1915. Born Temple Ewell. Enlisted Dover. Resided Temple Ewell. Son of Harry and Elizabeth Maxted of Temple Ewell, Dover, Kent. Commemorated on the Loos Memorial, Pas de Calais, France.

MAXTED H.J

Lance Corporal G/8459 Henry John MAXTED. 6th Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 4th August 1915. Born Temple Ewell. Enlisted Dover. Son of Harry and Elizabeth Maxted of Temple Ewell, Dover, Kent Resided Temple Ewell. Commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme, France. Pier and Face 5D.

MAXTED W.G

Private 42479 Walter George MAXTED. 11th Battalion, Essex Regiment. Formerly (31383) Suffolk Regiment. Died 4th August 1918 aged 34 years. Born Temple Ewell. Enlisted Dover. Resided Temple Ewell. Son of Harry and Elizabeth Maxted of Temple Ewell, Dover, Kent. Husband of E.F. Maxted of Temple Ewell. Buried Nine Elms Cemetery, Poperinge, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. Grave reference - XV.C.1.

MAXTED W.C

Private T/240412 William Colbred MAXTED. 5th Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Formerly (1648) The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 24th February 1917. Born and resided Wye. Enlisted Ashford. Commemorated by Special Memorial (Screen Wall) located in Amara War Cemetery, Iraq.

MAXTED W.H

Lieutenant William Henry MAXTED. 3 Squadron, Royal Air Force. Died 17th December 1918 aged 19 years. Son of James Samuel and Minnie Maxted of Hemel Hempstead, Hertfordshire. Buried Etaples Military Cemetery. Grave reference - XLV. A.12.

PHILPOTT H.H

Stoker 1st Class K/21845 Horace Henry PHILPOTT. Royal Navy. H.M.S. Pathfinder. Died 5th September 1914. Son of Mr F.W. Philpott, 39 Stonehall Village, Lydden, Dover, Kent. Commemorated on the Chatham Naval Memorial. Panel 6.

H.M.S. Partridge was the first RN vessel sunk by a German submarine when she was torpedoed in the North Sea by the U-21 commanded by Otto Hershing.

RICHARDS E

Private 141973 Edwin James RICHARDS. Machine Gun Corps (Infantry). Formerly (8424) The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 23rd April 1918. Born Temple Ewell. Enlisted Dover.

RICHARDS C.W.P

Engine Room Artificer (4th Class) George William Powney RICHARDS. Royal Navy. H.M.S. P.26. Died 10th April 1917 aged 22 years. Born North Wingfield, Derbyshire. Son of Charles Henry and Ellen Richards of Stone Hall House, Lydden, Dover, Kent. Buried Ste Marie Cemetery, Le Harve, Seine-Maritime, France. Division 62. Grave I.

H.M.S. P.26 was the patrol boat attached to the hospital ship H.M.S. Salta. Both vessels were sunk by mine.

RIGDEN A.V

Private G/6164 Albert Victor RIGDEN. 1st Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 15th September 1916 aged 19 years. Born and resided Temple Ewell. Enlisted Dover. Son of William and Eliza Rigden of "Vine Cottage," Temple

Ewell, Dover, Kent. Commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme, France.
Pier & Face 5D.

Brother of J.F Rigden.

RIGDEN J.F

Private 57167 James Frank RIGDEN. 9th Battalion, Welsh Regiment. Formerly (G/9070) The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Died 29th October 1916 aged 21 years. Born Temple Ewell. Enlisted Dover. Resided Temple Ewell. Son of William and Eliza Rigden of "Vine Cottage," Temple Ewell, Dover, Kent. Commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme, France.

ROGERS A.H

Private 74899 Arthur Henry ROGERS. 31st British Stationary Hospital, Royal Army Medical Corps (RAMC). Died 31st July 1917. Born Temple Ewell. Enlisted Warwick. Buried Baghdad (North Gate) Cemetery. Grave reference - XII.B.9.

Rifleman 2116 William WEST. 4th Battalion, Rifle Brigade. Died 21st February 1917 aged 31 years. Born Dover. Enlisted Chatham. Resided Temple Ewell. Son of John and Frances West of 4 Dour Terrace, Temple Ewell, Dover, Kent. Commemorated on the Mikra Memorial, Greece.
